The Pulaski County Committee of the Republican Party of Virginia, pursuant to the Plan of Organization of the Republican Party of Virginia, hereby adopts these Rules for the conduct of this Party Canvass.

- The Republican Party Canvass shall be held at the Big Red Barn 4241Lee Hwy Pulaski VA 24301(or alternate location) on August 6, 2022, from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM. The purpose of the Canvass shall be to nominate candidates to the Board of Supervisors for the Cloyd, Robinson, and Massie Districts
- 2. This party canvass shall, to the extent applicable, be governed by and conducted in accordance with the following (giving precedence as listed): the State Party Plan, District or Unit Plan or By-Laws, these rules, and otherwise in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised.
- 3. Only individuals who are registered to vote as of the day of the party canvass shall be entitled to vote, except as provided for in Article I, Section A.2. of the Plan of Organization of the Republican Party of Virginia. No proxies are allowed at any time.
- 4. All voters shall meet the requirements as specified in the Call of the Party Canvass. Only registered voters of Pulaski County who reside in the Cloyd, Robinson, and Massie Districts may vote in this Party Canvass.
- 5. The Pulaski County Unit Chairman shall appoint a Credentials Committee of not more than 7 persons, to register persons to vote and to count the ballots once the polls are closed. A majority of the members of the Credentials Committee shall remain inside the room in which voting is conducted during the period in which voting takes place and until the ballots are counted.
- 6. The Credentials Committee shall determine whether individuals who have pre-filed meet the qualifications for the office sought, subject

to appeal. The appeal shall be submitted to the 9<sup>th</sup> District Chairman whose decision shall be final.

- 7. No resolutions may be introduced.
- 8. Each candidate on the ballot shall be entitled to designate one individual who is not the candidate to observe the conduct of the party canvass.
- 9. No one will be allowed in the voting area without proper authorization. Candidates shall not loiter or campaign in the room in which voting will take place. No campaigning will be allowed within forty feet of the entrance to the voting location.
- The Credentials Committee shall prepare ballots listing the names of all qualified candidates for contested nominations or elections, who have properly filed as required in the Call of the Party Canvass. Ballots will be printed with candidate names and be different colors for each District: Cloyd, Robinson and Massie.
- 11. Any voter who is in line at 2:00 PM, but has not yet voted, shall be entitled to cast his vote. A member of the Credentials Committee shall stand at the end of the line to ensure that no further voters join the line once the time for the closing of the polls has arrived.
- 12. As soon as the polls are closed, the Credentials Committee shall immediately proceed to ascertain the vote given at the Canvass and shall continue without adjournment until they declare the results of the canvass. Only the members of the Credentials Committee and one representative of each candidate, if any, shall be permitted to remain in the room once the polls have closed and until the ballots are counted. Ballots shall then be placed in a sealed envelope and preserved and secured by the Credentials Committee for at least thirty (30) days in the event of any challenge to the results.

- 13. Candidates shall be elected on the basis of plurality of votes received. If two or more persons have an equal number of votes and a higher number than any other person, the Credentials Committee shall proceed publicly to determine by lot which of the persons shall be declared elected, after those persons have been notified and are allowed an opportunity to be present.
- 14. The Credentials Committee shall preserve order inside and outside the polling place(s). No person shall hinder, intimidate, or interfere with any qualified voter so as to prevent the voter from casting a secret ballot. The Credentials Committee may order a person violating this Rule to cease such action and, if such action continues, may remove such person from the polling place.
